

REQUEST TO TAKE AN ARTS & SCIENCE GRADUATE COURSE

In exceptional circumstances, undergraduate students in the Faculty of Arts & Science may be granted permission to take a graduate course sponsored by an Arts & Science graduate unit as part of the student's undergraduate degree.

Permission of the sponsoring department is required. The graduate unit may also require the instructor's written permission. Use of such a course toward a student's program requirements is at the discretion of the undergraduate program sponsor. For degree requirement purposes, a graduate course will count as the equivalent of a 400-level course.

To be considered for a graduate course students must complete this form and submit it to the department.

Notice of Collection of Personal Information: Freedom of Information and Privacy Act
