

Lecture Capture (Snagit) Summary:

- Lecture Capture software (Snagit) is available to download at <https://licenses.act.utoronto.ca/products/1>. UTORid and password are required.
 - You can use MyMedia (<https://mymedia.library.utoronto.ca>) to store and disseminate video lectures. UTORid and password are required.

For faculty looking for alternatives to deliver their lecture, you may opt to use a video capture software which the university makes available to faculty and staff. The software, Snagit, can be installed on a desktop or laptop which has a microphone and camera. It can be downloaded here (<https://licenses.act.utoronto.ca/products/1>). You will need to login using your UTORid and password to access the download page.

Snagit benefits

- Recordings are captured at the user's computer or laptop.
- Recordings can be manually uploaded to any, or as many, streaming services, as needed. (i.e., MyMedia, YouTube).
- Recordings are to the desktop or a designated folder on the user's computer. These files can be copied to a USB key or other drive and retained indefinitely as a personal backup copy.
- Simple editing tools are available that allow users to excerpt portions of the recording. (Recording using a web camera is optional).

To disseminate or archive your video lecture, you can use MyMedia (<https://mymedia.library.utoronto.ca>). This is a tool that the university provides for faculty, staff, and students to store video and audio files. Files uploaded may be restricted to the University of Toronto Community or shared publicly. You will need your UTORid and password to login.
